
#### **DIFFERENT PERSON**

8:00 AM, I become a different person: Bathed, alert, and speaking in complete sentences. Stop by any morning and you'll watch me change before your eyes. (Please don't stop by.)



People change all the time. The woman who loses a 100 pounds. The girl who suddenly excels on the field. The young person who embraces a call to ministry... and another one who drifts away. Some folks seem to stay the same for decades, but they haven't. If nothing else they have shed their actual skin a thousand times over.

I have my hands full negotiating all that change. My own physical, mental, and emotional changes...and yours. It's exhausting, even,

constantly adjusting to each other and ourselves. Everybody's in flux. It's part of life.

And then, Samuel (God) makes things even more complicated. He tells Saul that he's about to be changed into "an entirely different person." This is a holy change, a spiritual one, a change that fully aligns Saul with God, and prepares him to become King.

The ladies of the United Methodist Church have been very good at using their gifts to encourage and uplift the congregation for over 150 years.



In Our Reaview Mirror by Teresa Weixelman

Earliest records go back to 1907. At that time the

women's organization was called "The Ladies and Pastors Christian Union." By 1913 the name had been shortened to "The Ladies Aid". A very appropriate name for the work they did.

In 1907 the minutes indicate that they pledged \$1000 to the building fund. That must have been a very generous pledge. An entry in June 1907 shows that they made \$4.95 at the food sale. A lot of food sales were needed to raise \$1000. They had food sales, sold cookbooks, made quilts, held silver teas, served dinners, wove rugs, held ice cream socials and served in many other capacities as they answered God's call to serve in our small town. They paid the last \$400 of the \$1000 pledge in November 1908. And... on March 25, 1909 they pledged another \$1000 on the day the new church was dedicated. The church that we sit in on Sunday mornings 112 years later.

As you sit in church on Sunday morning, take a moment to reflect on the early 1900's and give thanks for the ladies of our church who still cook food, serve funeral dinners, make quilts, and run The Thrift Shop with such dedication and devotion that they can sponsor numerous missions in our town, our state, our nation and our world. Thank you, United Methodist Women for 150 years of service and dedication.



Dorothy Garrett found this picture while sorting through church archives. Taken in 1909, it shows the ladies of the church (probably The Ladies Aid) gathered around a large hole where a tree is being planted. The lady in front with

the shovel is Mrs. J.E. Stewart. She would become Bart Stewart's great, great grandmother.
